

TED TURNER

Throughout his career, Ted Turner has received recognition for his entrepreneurial acumen, sharp business skills, leadership qualities, and his unprecedented philanthropy.

Whether in billboard advertisement, cable television, sports, environmental initiatives or philanthropy, Turner's vision, determination, generosity and forthrightness have consistently given the world reason to take notice.

He is chairman of the United Nations Foundation, co-chairman of the Nuclear Threat Initiative, chairman of the Turner Foundation, and co-founder of Ted's Montana Grill.

Turner is also chairman of Turner Enterprises, which manages his business interests, land holdings and investments, including the oversight of two million acres and 55,000 bison.

GARY JOBSON

Gary is a world class sailor, television commentator and author based in Annapolis, Maryland. He is President of US SAILING, the National Governing Body of Sailing. Gary has authored 17 sailing books and is Editor at Large of Sailing World and Cruising World magazines.

He has won many championships in one design classes, the America's Cup with Ted Turner, the infamous Fastnet Race and many of the world's ocean races. In College at SUNY Maritime he was an All American sailor three times and was twice named College Sailor of the Year.

In 2003, after years of committed service on behalf of The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society, Jobson was diagnosed with lymphoma and, in his words, "became a beneficiary of the research advances I had helped support." He is now cancer-free.

- Start Early! Set a fundraising goal for yourself and your crew.
- Online Fundraising: Take advantage of your LLS online fundraising website
 by registering at gsf.regatta.llsevent.org —a fast and easy way to raise money!
 Once registered, you'll receive an email with your login and password. Follow
 the instructions provided on page 9-10 of this Fundraising Manual to get your
 webpage up and running. Make a personal pledge.
- Write a letter and send it to your contact list. One of the best ways to raise
 money is to put your request in writing.
- Matching Gifts: Many corporations have matching gift programs and will often
 match gifts given by you and other employees. Contact your human resources
 department for more information. This is an easy way to double or triple your
 money!
- Use your honorary skipper member's picture and add a letter from him/her in your recruiting fundraising appeals.
- Conduct a third party fundraising event to create more awareness.

Personal Website tab allows you to:

- Enter/Change "Fundraising Goal" amount
- Customize text and share your personal story on your webpage by updating "Fundraising Page Statement"
- Add a personal note to the "Email Thank You Message" sent to your donors
- Enter/Change your "Fundraising Page Nickname" (it is the last portion of your URL)
- Upload a personal image that is 400 x 400 pixels max



- Always click on **Update** to save your changes
- Write your own email and include your fundraising weblink in your message to begin fundraising via email. To find your personal website link, look above your "fundraising goal box." Your friends and family will click the link to your fundraising webpage where they can "Make a Secure Online Donation" to support your efforts.

On Sunday, October 21st, I'm raising my sails to raise funds for The Leukemia & Lyrnphoma Society through participation in The San Francisco Yacht Club's seventh annual Leukemia Cup Regattat

This year marks the 6th year that Jet lag has been racing to find a cure, to date we have rasied over \$50,000 in donations. We wish to thank those that have been apart of this great effort. Last year atotal of 1,020,000 was raised by friends and farmily of the \$F. Chapter, settling a national record for money raised.

The Leukemia Cup Regatta is chaired by 1977 America's Cup winner and ESPN commentator Gary Jobson, who is also a lymphoma survivor. The Leukemia Cup series and its participants raise funds for lifesaving research that discovers cutting edge treatments and new drug therapies for blood cancers bringing us closer to cures.

LLS is the world's largest voluntary health organization dedicated to funding blood cancer research and providing education and patient services. The mission of The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society is to find cures for leukemia, lymphoma, Hodgkin's disease and myeloma, and improve the quality of life of patients and their families.

Thanks to funds raised through events like The Leukemia Cup Regatta, we are making progress.

- Since 1949, the survival rate for many blood cancer patients has doubled, tripled, and in some cases quadrupled
- In the 1960's, a child's chance of surviving leukemia was 3%; today, 90% can expect to survive into adulthood.
- Since the 1960's, Hodgkin lymphoma patient survival rates have more than doubled to 88%
- · Forty years ago, 1 in 10 myeloma patients survived. Today, that number has more than tripled.

And today, some LLS funded drugs are used to treat patients with rare forms of stomach and skin cancers and are being tested in clinical trials for a range of cancers including lung, brain, breast, pancreatic and prostate. Drugs like Gleevec, Sprycel, Arinza, Tasigna and Zolinza are now being tested for patients with other non-cancerous diseases like Diabetes, Pheumatoid Arthritis and Multiple Scierosis.
